ROSÉ

Patient Cottat was a famous Master Goldsmith in the mid-19th century in France. Born in Paris, he loved the Berry region of central France. Anciennes Vignes is a Pinot Noir wine from the prestigious Sancerre appellation in the Loire Valley.



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| Appellation: | Sancerre |
| Grape Variety: | 100% Pinot Noir |
| Age of Vines: | 10-15 years old |
| Soil: | Limestone |
| Yield: Production | 3-4 tons/acre |
| Area: | 8 acres |
| Vinification: | The grapes are quickly transported to the winery in small-size trailers. The pink color is extracted via a short maceration (6-12 hrs). The grapes are then gently pressed into a pneumatic press. The juices are fermented in stainless steel tanks for 15-20 days at a temperature ranging from 57-64°F. |
| Alcohol Content: | 12.5% ABV |
| Acidity: | 4 -5.3 g/l |
| Residual Sugar: | 1-3 g/l |
| Tasting Notes: | <i>Color :</i> Light salmon pink <i>Aroma:</i> Lovely nose recalling red berry fruits and citrus <i>Palate:</i> Tense, ample aromatic presence on the palate. A delightful, balanced wine with a lovely spicy finish. |
| Serving Temperature: | 50-54°F |
| Suggested Dishes: | A successful pairing for fish, Asian food, and fresh salads |
